Dr. Joy DeGruy-Leary, is the author of *Post Traumatic Slave Syndrome* and Associate Professor of Social Work at Portland State University. An internationally renowned lecturer and consultant on matters of race, culture, and education, Dr. DeGruy-Leary has developed the African-American Male Youth Respect Scale. She has been a speaker and consultant to The U.N. World Conference on Racism, The Urban League, the NAACP, the NBA, The National Association of Social Workers, and The Essence Women of Leadership Summit.

jona olsson has been a political activist and educator for over three decades. She is the founder and director of *cultural bridges*, which offers cultural diversity programs for non-profit organizations. jona is Chief of the Latir Volunteer Fire Department, and works with local, state and regional racial and gender justice groups. She is the author of a number of essays on justice issues, including "DETOUR-SPOTTING for white anti-racists."
